ANBO-II was the second aircraft of the Lithuanian aircraft designer Antanas Gustaitis.

ANBO-II - light multipurpose aircraft. It was operated from 1927 to 1931 as a training aircraft for young military pilots. In 1931, after major repairs and modification, it was transferred to the Aero Club of Lithuania. The plane crashed and was written off in 1934.

The plane was not produced in series, yet it served as a prototype for latter trainers ANBO-III and ANBO-V/51, developed by Antanas Gustaitis.
