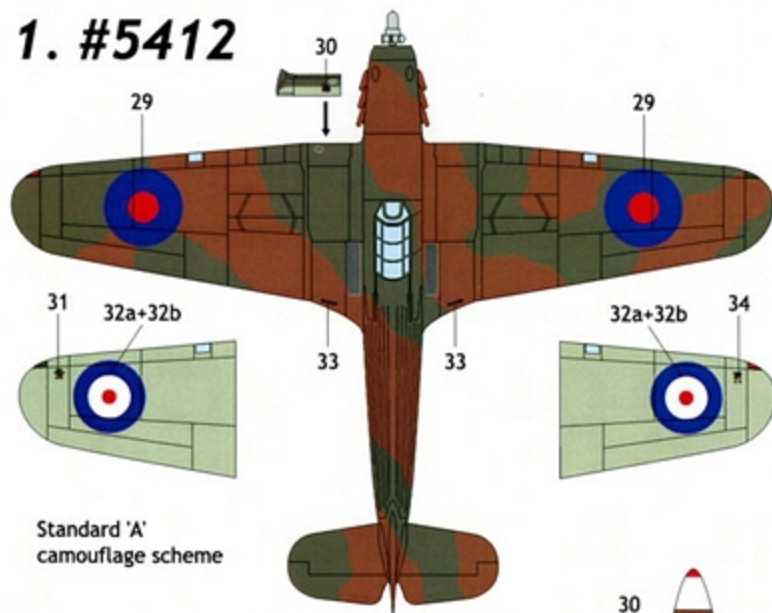
Hurricane Mk. XII (IIB) / Hurricane MK.IIC

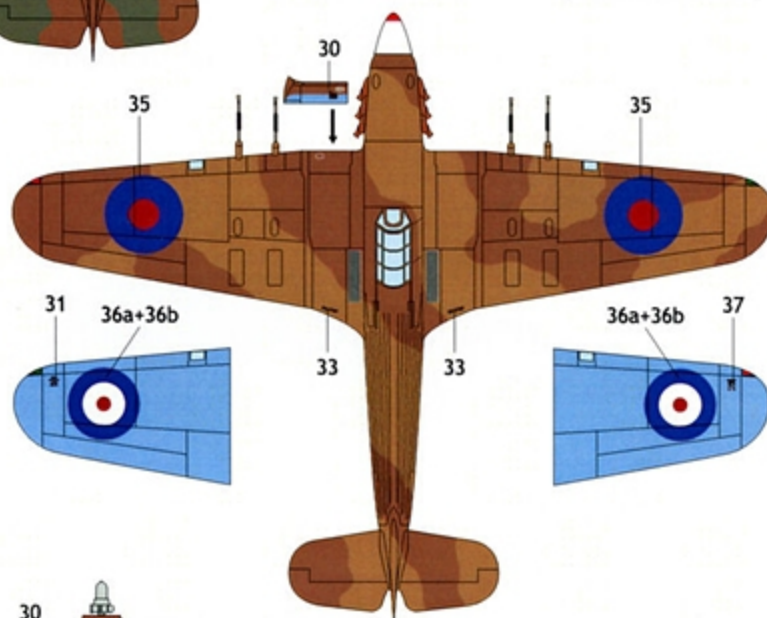
Standard 'A' camouflage scheme

Aircraft 1 was fitted with the early 12-gun wing.

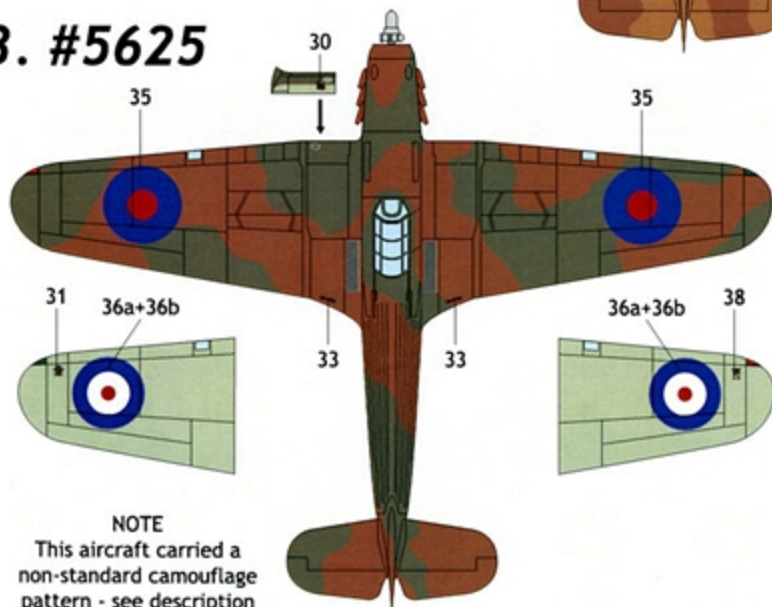

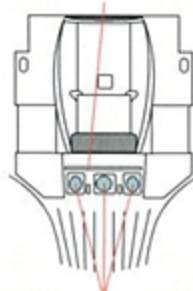

Canadian HURRICANES

1. Hurricane Mk.XII (Mk.IIB), 135 Bulldog Squadron, RCAF
135 Squadron RCAF (Home Defence Establishment) was one of the units responsible for the defence of the West Coast of Canada from October 1942 until May of 1944 when the Hurricanes were replaced by Kittyhawk Mk.IVs. Note the 'bright' colour roundels. Hamilton Standard 10'8" propeller with no spinner.

2. Hurricane Mk.IIC, 213 Squadron, RAF
One of the Hurricanes flown by P/O Houle (RCAF) serving with 213 Squadron in the spring of 1942. 213 Squadron operated out of Edku, Egypt in the defence of the harbour at Alexandria. They painted the squadron hornet on the fuselage roundels of several of their airplanes.

3. Hurricane Mk.XII (Mk.IIB), #13 Photo Squadron RCAF
13 Photo Squadron RCAF (Home Defence Establishment) was formed from #1 Photo Flight (RCAF), an experimental photo reconnaissance unit sponsored by the RAF. Along with a varied collection of aircraft that included Ansons, Norsemen, B-25s and Spitfires, the Hurricane was involved in the photo-mapping of Canada in 1944. The nose art was worn on the port side only on all aircraft of the unit. Note exhaust glare shields on cowling and non-standard fuselage roundels. Note this aircraft carried a non-standard camouflage scheme which was unique to this unit's Hurricanes and Spitfires. The camouflage pattern shown is based on surviving photographs. Hamilton Standard 10'8" propeller with no spinner.

- Apply decals only on smooth and glossy surfaces.
- Carefully cut the decal that you need from the sheet.
- Dip in clean water for about 10 seconds, then lay on absorbent paper towel for 30 seconds.
- Apply setting solution to the desired area.
- Slide the decal from its backing paper using a soft paintbrush.
- After 5 minutes apply decal solvent solution and wait overnight.
- Wash decal residue from kit and later apply final coat.

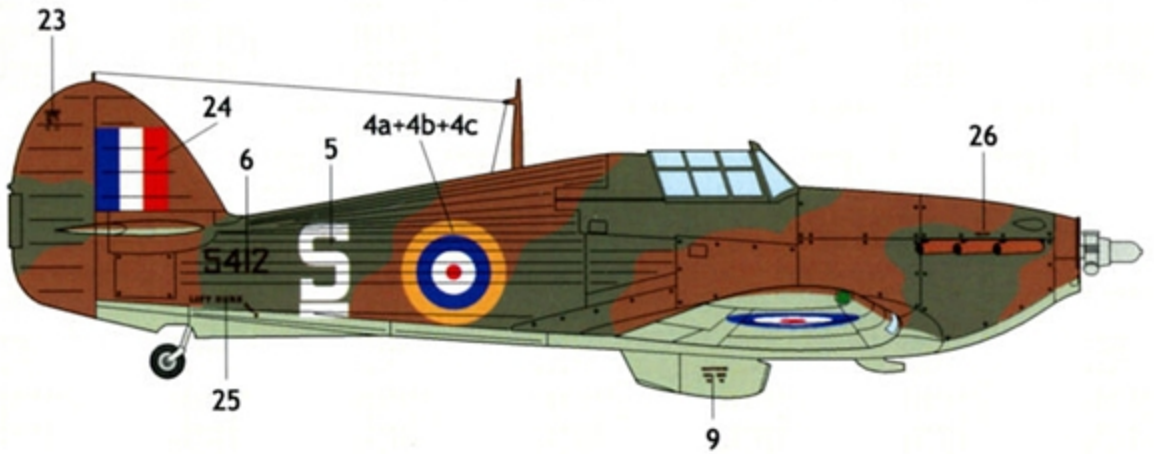

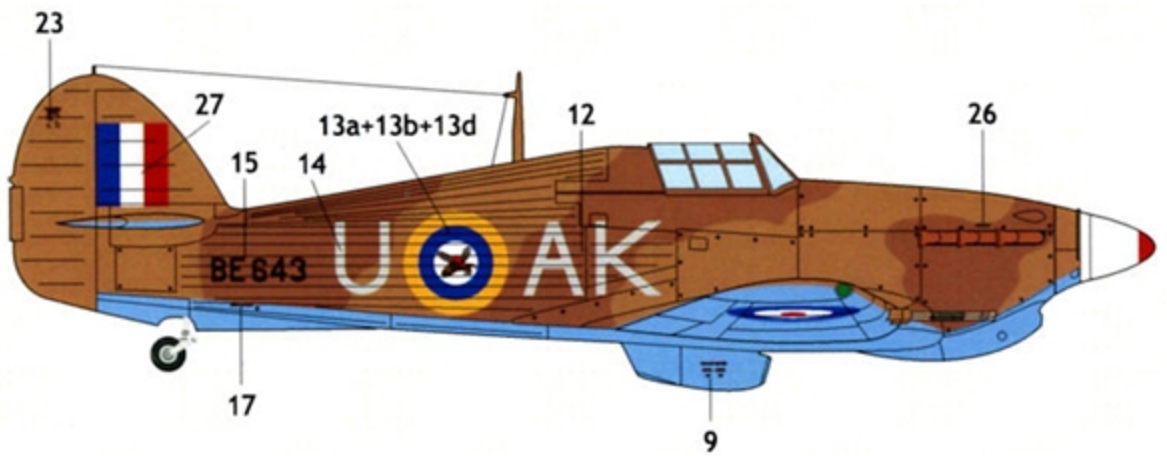

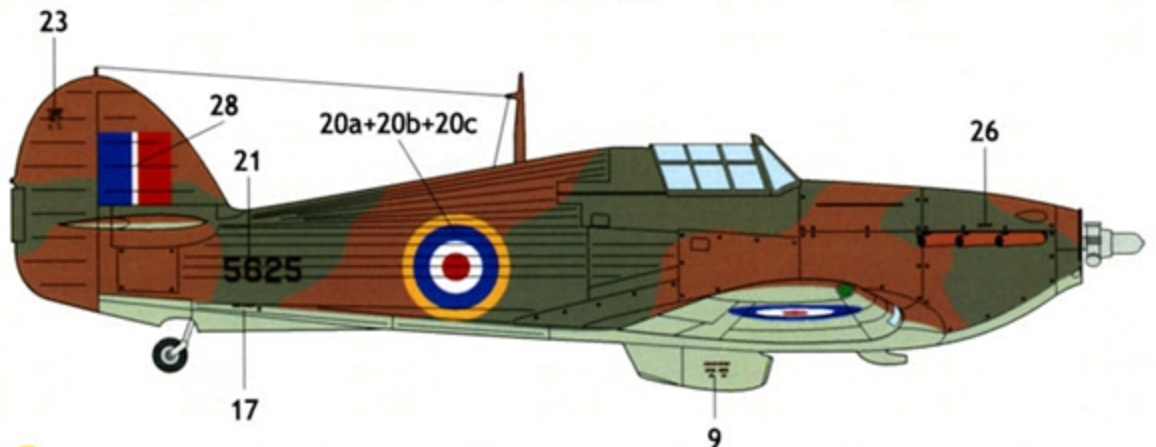
