ANBO-III was the third aircraft of the Lithuanian aircraft designer **Antanas Gustaitis**.

ANBO-III - was a parasol type two-seater monoplane of mixed construction, designed for the advanced training of pilots.

In 1930-1931 two series (first series – No. 39, 40, 41, 42 and second series – No.44, 45, 47, 48) were built and were actively operated until the Soviet occupation in 1940. At first the airplanes of 2<sup>nd</sup> series (No 44, 45, 47 and 48) had 9-cylinder 145hp Walter Mars engines. Late these aircrafts were equipped with more reliable 5-cylinder 150hp A.S. Mongoose engines. Also, the planes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> series were 0.5m longer than the first ones.

At the beginning, ANBO-III was also used for reconnaissance purposes.
